First-hand interaction with Israelis:

- Facilitating meaningful encounters with attack survivors, IDF personnel, and citizens, offering opportunities to listen, support, and show solidarity.
- Spending time with evacuees.
- Engaging in conversation with the Druze community in the north.
- Connecting with Holocaust survivors.

Serving the Nation

Hands-on service projects where participants provide direct assistance:

- Serving IDF soldiers at Gilat & Shuva Junctions.
- Caring for children from surrounding nations in Israel for lifesaving cardiac surgery.
- Helping meet needs of those making Aliyah.
- Working at Heritage Forests & Farm, an organic tree farm on the Golan Heights.
- Volunteering at food distribution centers in Ashdod and Sderot providing aid to those who recently made Aliyah and the Druze in Syria.
- Providing emergency relief supplies to IDF lone soldiers at The Michael Levin Base.
- Providing financial support to meet essential needs of those living in the land.

To date, we have taken five teams with members from Canada, Australia, the USA, Scotland, and England, and their lives have been forever impacted. Here are some of their thoughts about their experience:
